What's Working

- **Strong programs** to support local youth and community
- **Centralized location** on Chicago Ave.
- **Good keywords** such as "Chicago farm, volunteer" yield top search results
- **Organic reach** through word of mouth via volunteers and supporters

Current Issues

- Lack of awareness about the farm and its offerings
- Limited staffing resources to support outreach efforts
- Uncertain future due to planned housing development

Recommendation: Storytelling and Public Engagement

With a small staff and limited resources, the farm can demonstrate its value in the following ways:

- Work with volunteers and high school youth to create content, capitalizing on already strong organic outreach
- **Use testimonials** to show the human impact of the farm's programming
 - $\circ~$ Video stories and interviews
 - Quotes on website
 - Social media spotlights
- **Connect farm's mission back to sustainability** and food security to demonstrate the impact the farm has on supporting the local community and our environment

Receive storytelling and media outreach support as part of Public Narrative's goal of amplifying nonprofit and neighborhood voices.



The Conservation Fund

Gain support through the Chicago Metro Farms Fund to secure farm land and continue providing food access to the community.
